



Do you have a baby under three months old?

The Infant Screening Project is a collaboration between Boston Children's Hospital/Harvard Medical School, Boston University, and the Pediatric Physicians' Organization at Children's Hospital (PPOC).

We are studying early development and early identification of Autism Spectrum Disorder and/or language and social communication difficulties. By screening infants and learning more about your child's development, we aim to improve methods for identifying children who would benefit most from early intervention.

Participating children:

will be involved until they are three years old. We will schedule 5 visits at regular time points (3, 12, 18, 24, and 36 months) at your convenience during the work week or on weekends. All visits will be at our child-friendly facility in the Longwood Medical Area.

Participating families receive:

- free parking
- childcare for other siblings
- up to a \$100 payment
- a small toy for each child

We will refer infants and children for a formal clinical evaluation through the Developmental Medicine Center at BCH if concerns are identified during research assessments.
